UKRAINIAN EMERGENCY WINTER APPEAL

Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason a new Emergency Winter Appeal has been launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine which are suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis. The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics: grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea, coffee, biscuits, etc. It is hoped that £160,000 can be raised to allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need.

AN EPIPHANY BLESSING FOR THE HOME

The Feast of the Epiphany is celebrated on the twelfth day after Christmas, 6th January. This short ceremony is a traditional way of marking our homes, with sacred signs and symbols, as we ask God's blessing upon those who live, work or visit throughout the coming year:

All: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord;

and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts:

gold for a great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh as a symbol of His burial.

Using chalk, the following signs are marked upon or above the main door:

$$20 + C + M + B + 23$$

All: Lord God, you once used a star

to show to all the world that Jesus is your Son.

May the light of the star that guided the wise men to his birth,

now guide us to recognise him

in the epiphanies of the daily experiences of our lives.

As we go about our work, our study, our play,

keep us in its light and in your love.

May all who enter here find your gracious hospitality,

for Christ has come to dwell in this house and in these hearts.

May Christ bless our home. Amen.

What the signs mean:

The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the customary names of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. They are also an acronym for: "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" - "May Christ bless this house". The year (2023) is divided before and after these letters. The crosses represent the blessing and protection of Christ.

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK

This weekend is the **Solemnity of Mary. Mother of God** – the divine maternity of Mary was proclaimed as a belief and teaching of the Church at the Council of Ephesus in 431; in more recent times, the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) made the meaning explicit: "that Christ should be recognised, in the truest sense, as the Son of God and the Son of Man". Before this feast was inserted into the revised Roman calendar, the first day of the year had been dedicated to the remembrance of the circumcision of the Lord, which took place eight days after his birth, as prescribed by Jewish law.

Monday is the **Memorial of SS Basil the Great & Gregory Nazienzen** - bishops and doctors of the Church. Basil the Great, a Father of the Greek Church, struggled against the Arian heresy and was the principal monastic legislator of the East. He lived in Cappadocia (in modern Turkey) from 328 to 379. His cult was brought to the West by Greek monks as well as by St Benedict, who was profoundly inspired by 'our holy father Basil'. Gregory grew up in a family of pious Christians, son of the bishop of Nazianzus (also in Cappadocia). A lifelong friend of St Basil, he joined him in the struggle against Arianism. One of the fathers of the Greek Church, he was already bishop of Nazianzus when the Emperor Theodosius sent him to Constantinople to bring that city back to orthodoxy. Greeted with stones, he eventually succeeded.
