THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Tuesday is the Memorial of St Agatha, virgin martyr – martyred in Sicily, she was much venerated from about the third century. Very little is known for certain about this virgin-martyr - but she has been included in the Roman Canon since the earliest centuries. As she was martyred, her breasts were cut off; in iconography, she is often shown holding them in a dish. Amongst other things, she is patron saint of bell ringers.

Wednesday is the Memorial of St Paul Miki and Companions, martyrs - at the same time that the Church in this country was suffering persecution, Japan was also producing many martyrs. Among them were today's saints - brutally put to death, mainly by crucifixion, at Nagasaki in 1597.
