CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD during the Mass at 11.30 am

From this weekend the Children's Liturgy of the Word will re-commence, following a break during the pandemic. It is not a creche or other child-minding service, but an integral part of the Sunday Mass, celebrated in a way that is better suited to children. The Liturgy is for those who have not started preparation for First Holy Communion and the minimum age is 2 years. THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK ...

Tuesday is the **Memorial of St John Chrysostom** – his 'surname' was more of a nickname – meaning 'golden mouth' – a tribute to the constant high quality of his homilies. Although he was Archbishop of Constantinople, he died in exile in 407.

Wednesday is the **Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross** – this ancient feast has been celebrated in the East since the fourth century and was adopted in the West three centuries later. It commemorates the recovery, by the Empress Helena (mother of Constantine), of the precious relic of the cross on which Jesus died. From the instrument used in that most infamous death, the cross has been transformed into the symbol of Christ's glorification – Christ 'loved the world so much'.

Thursday is the **Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows** – traditionally seven in number, the sorrows begin with Simeon's words to Our Lady in the Temple: 'A sword will pierce your own soul' (Luke 2:35).

Friday is the **Memorial of SS Cornelius and Cyprian** – Pope Cornelius and Bishop Cyprian lived and died for the Faith in the first half of the third century.
