#### THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Thursday is the **National Memorial of St Alban, first martyr of Britain** – put to death during a persecution sometime in the third century. St Alban's Abbey (now a cathedral) marks the traditional site of his death.

Friday is the **Memorial of St Aloysius Gonzaga, religious** - this good young man joined the Jesuits, wanting to be a priest. But in 1591, at the age of twenty-three, he died from the plague which he caught while nursing its victims.
