THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Monday is the **Memorial of St Jane Frances de Chantal, religious** – she was widowed, with four children, when still quite young. Later, with St Francis de Sales, she founded the Visitation nuns. She died in 1641.

Tuesday is the **Memorial of Saints Pontian and Hippolytus** – both were martyrs of the early third century: Pontian being Pope and Hippolytus a priest. It is from the writings of Hippolytus that we know many details of the life and worship of Christians of that era.

Wednesday is the **Memorial of St Maximilian Kolbe, priest and martyr** — during the Nazi occupation of his Polish homeland, this Capuchin friar harboured over 2000 Jews and other refugees. Arrested and taken to the original Auschwitz concentration camp, he begged to be allowed to die in place of another. Thrown into one of the notorious starvation cells, he was finished off with a lethal injection of phenol. He was canonised by Pope John Paul II in 1982.

Thursday is the **Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary** – in 1950, Pope Pius XII declared that the Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. This declaration is one of the three infallible statements issued by popes in the 2000-year history of the Church; it formalised and made explicit, a long-held belief of the Church. The Feast of the Assumption was celebrated here in England in the Middle Ages – far earlier than the rest of Europe. Indeed, there are many medieval churches today known as "St Mary's" whose original dedication was: "The Assumption of Mary".

Friday is the **Memorial of St Stephen of Hungary** – an example of what a good Christian ruler should be; he died in 1038.

"I am the bread of life, Jesus says. Let us pause on this beautiful image of Jesus. He could have offered a rationale, a demonstration, but – we know – Jesus speaks in parables, and in this expression: "I am the bread of life", he truly sums up his entire being and mission. This will be seen completely at the end, at the Last Supper. Jesus knows that the Father is asking him not only to give food to people, but to give himself, to break himself, his own life, his own flesh, his own heart so that we might have life. These words of the Lord reawaken in us our amazement for the gift of the Eucharist. No one in this world, as much they might love another person, can make themselves become food for them. God did so, and does so, for us. Let us renew this amazement. Let us do so as we adore the Bread of Life, because adoration fills life with amazement." – **Pope Francis**
