THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Monday is the **Memorial of St Charles Lwanga and Companions, martyrs** – in the mid-1880s, Charles Lwanga and twenty-one other Catholic men and boys were cruelly put to death in Uganda. They were canonised by Pope Paul VI in 1964. Together with many other Christians, Catholic and Protestant, they suffered persecution under the anti-Christian King Mwanga.

Wednesday is the **Memorial of St Boniface, bishop and martyr** – a great English missionary. Born in c 675, he left England in 718 to preach the gospel in Germany, where he is still held in high esteem. Even in old age he did not rest but went on to evangelise Holland, where he was martyred, about 754.

Thursday is the **Memorial of St Norbert**, **bishop** – among his many achievements for the Church in the early twelfth century, this bishop founded the Canons Regular of Premontré, the 'Premonstratensian Canons' or Norbertines. He lived from 1080 to 1134.

Friday is the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus – symbol of Christ's love for all.
