Thursday is the **Feast of St Stephen, first martyr** – this deacon's final glorious spoken witness to Christ is recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. The first martyr of the Church: his last words and death are typical of many martyrs since then. It is worth remembering that the word *'martyr'* means 'witness': in his death, Stephen gave the ultimate witness to Christ.

Friday is the **Feast of St John, apostle and evangelist** – the word 'love' sums up his New Testament writings: God's love for us, our love for him in return, and the love we should have for one another.
