MUSIC DURING HOLY COMMUNION

On this, the weekend of Remembrance Sunday, we hear a chant from Kiev: the Kontakion of the Departed:

So sviatymi upokoi, Khriste, dushy rab tvoikh, idezhe nest bolezn' ni pechal, ni vozdykhanie, no zhizn' beskonechnaia. Sam edin esi bessmertnyi, sotvorivyi, i sozdavyi cheloveka, zemnii ubo ot zemli sozdakhomsi, i v zemliu tuiuzhde poidem, iakozhe povelel esi, sozdavyi mia i rekii mi, iako zemlia esi, i v zemliu otideshi, amozzhe vsi chelovetsi poidem, nadgrobnoe rydanie tvoriashche pèsn'. Alliluiia, alliluiia, alliluiia.

Give rest, O Christ, to thy servant(s) with thy saints: Where sorrow and pain are no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting. Thou only art immortal, the Creator and Maker of man, and we are mortal, formed of the earth. And unto earth shall we return, for so thou didst ordain, when thou created me saying: 'Dust thou art and unto dust shalt thou return'. All we go down to the dust; and weeping over the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia.

NOVEMBER – MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

November is the month when we especially remember our dead and their influence on us, the living. We also pray for them and offer Masses for the repose of their souls in the eternal life of God. Our

custom here, for many years, is to leave the names of our loved ones before the altar throughout the month. Envelopes for this purpose are available in the porch; please place them in the offertory baskets, put them through the letter box at Church House or hand them in to the sacristy. Any offerings you make will help to provide Masses for the Holy Souls, celebrated during November and throughout the year.

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK

Monday is the Memorial of St Martin of Tours, bishop – a hard-working bishop in his diocese of Tours; he died in 397. What is possibly the oldest church in England still in use (in Canterbury) is dedicated to him, as is St Martin-in-the-Fields in Trafalgar Square.

Tuesday is the Memorial of St Josaphat, bishop and martyr – a saint from eastern Europe (in the area associated with present-day Ukraine, Lithuania and Belarus); he attempted to improve relations between the Catholic and Orthodox Churches. He was martyred in 1623.

Friday is the Memorial of St Albert the Great, bishop and teacher of the faith – a Dominican friar and master of many subjects, St Thomas Aquinas was one of his students (St Thomas became one of the most influential teachers in the Church, after St Paul and St Augustine of Hippo). St Albert died in 1280.

from Pope Francis, Angelus Address, St Peter's Square, 7 November 2021

The scene described in the Gospel of today's Liturgy takes place inside the Temple of Jerusalem. Jesus looks, he looks at what is happening in this most sacred of places; and he sees how the scribes love to walk around to be seen, greeted and revered, and in order to have the places of honour. And Jesus adds that they "devour widows' houses and recite long prayers in order to be seen" (cf. Mk 12:40). At the same time, another scene catches his eyes: a poor widow, precisely one of those exploited by the powers that be, puts "everything she had, her whole living" (Mk 12:44) in the Temple treasury. This is what the Gospel says, she puts everything she had to live on in the treasury. The Gospel presents us with this striking contrast: the rich who give from their surplus wealth to make themselves seen, and a poor woman, who without seeming to, offers every little bit she has. Two symbols of human attitudes.

Jesus watches the two scenes. And it is this very verb – "to watch" – that sums up his teaching: "we must watch out for" those who live their faith with duplicity, like the scribes, so as not to become like them; whereas we must "watch" the widow, and take her as a model. Let us reflect on this: to watch out for hypocrites and to watch the poor widow.
