MUSIC DURING HOLY COMMUNION

A setting by the English composer Thomas Tallis (c1505-1585) of *O sacrum convivium* - an antiphon in honour of the presence of Jesus we receive in Holy Communion:

O sacrum convivium in quo Christus sumitur. Recolitur memoria passionis eius, mens impletur gratia: et futurae gloriae nobis pignus datur.

O sacred feast in which we share in Christ. We recall the memory of his passion, our minds are filled with grace; and we receive the pledge of glory still to come.

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR THIS WEEK . . .

Monday is the **Feast of St Mary Magdalene**, **apostle to the apostles** – one of the women disciples of Jesus, she was present on Calvary at the foot of the cross, and was also a witness to her Lord, risen from the dead. In recognition of the importance of her role in the life of the infant Church, her liturgical celebration was raised from a simple 'Memorial' to a 'Feast Day' by Pope Francis.

Tuesday is the **European Feast of St Bridget of Sweden, religious and patron of Europe** – a fourteenth century Swede, devoted wife and mother of eight. As a widow, she founded the religious order of Bridgettines, one of their main apostolates is hospitality.

Wednesday is the **Memorial of St Charbel Makhlouf, priest** – a nineteenth century Maronite monk, priest and hermit in the Lebanon; his reputation for holiness prompted people to seek him to receive a blessing and to be remembered in his prayers. Following his death, Christians and Muslims soon made his tomb a place of pilgrimage; it was renowned for cures. Pope Paul VI beatified him in 1965 and canonised him twelve years later.

Thursday is the **Feast of St James, apostle** – this apostle, the brother of John, was the first to follow his Master in being put to death. According to tradition, he went to Spain to preach the gospel; whether this is an historical fact or not, his famous shrine at Santiago de Compostella still attracts pilgrims in their thousands.

Friday is the **Memorial of SS Joachim and Anne**, **parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary** – the parents of Our Lady, and hence, the maternal grandparents of Jesus. In France there is great devotion to St Anne, with churches and shrines in her honour – as at St Anne d'Auray.
